Day 1 - Tuesday, December 7, 2021

Day 2 - Wednesday, December8, 2021

Have breakfast (included) at the Post Oak Lodge. Meet a local sightseeing guide for a riding tour of historic Tulsa. The city is one of the nation's most extensive collections of Art Deco architecture. Throughout the city there are Art Deco churches, schools, gas stations, dry cleaners, and residences designed by such masters as Frank Lloyd Wright. After the riding tour, stop at the beautiful and charming Gilcrease Museum. It is home to the world's most comprehensive collection of art and artifacts from the American West. You can see large-scale works by Thomas Moran and bronze sculptures by Frederic Remington. Have lunch (included) at the La Villa Restaurant Philbrook Museum of Art, overlooking the beautiful exquisitely Italianinspired landscaped grounds. Take a docent-led tour of this Italianate villa built by oilman. Waite Phillips. It has evolved over time from a grand family estate to Tulsa's Art Center. This former private residence is filled with diverse collections of art from all over the world, including African, Asian and Modern American collections. Tonight, enjoy a special dinner (included) at the Post Oak Lodge. Drive to Broken Arrow tonight to spend at the Rhema Bible Church Christmas lights display. There are two million lights spread across the 110-acre campus. Walk through the display and celebrate Christmas Season. Concessions are available for purchase. [B,L]



Day 3 - Thursday, December 9, 2021

Have breakfast (included) at the Post Oak Lodge. Travel to Oklahoma City to visit the Oklahoma City National Memorial and Memorial Museum. A Park Ranger will give a 30-minute interpretation before a self-guided tour of the memorial and museum. Have lunch (included) at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum. Take a docent-led tour of the collection. There are more than 28,000 Western and American Indian art works and artifacts. The facility also has the world's most extensive collection of American rodeo photographs, barbed wire, saddlery, and early rodeo trophies. Tonight, take time for dinner (on own) in Utica Square. Then board an authentic trolley for a lights tour. Venture into some unique neighborhoods that celebrate the season with elaborate Christmas light arrangements and brilliant holiday décor. This route illuminates the magic of the season with inspiring and unforgettable light displays. Before returning to the hotel visit the Tulsa Botanic Garden. The Garden of Lights display offers a magical escape as you stroll through the center aglow and illuminated in special There are indoor activities and concessions are available to purchase. [B,L,]



Day 4 - Friday, December 10, 2021

Have breakfast (included) at Post Oak Lodge and travel to Claremore, OK. Visit the Will Rogers Museum. After an introduction in the main theater, spend time in the eight-galleries that display the world's largest collection of documents related to humorist, Will Rogers. William Penn Adair Rogers is noted as being first a Cherokee Indian, a cowboy, a national figure and a legend. The group will be seated in the main theater for an introduction. The visit the exhibits, grounds and displays on a self-guided tour. In Miami, OK to have lunch (included) and tour the historic Coleman Theater. Built in 1929 for George Coleman, a local mining magnate, it has a distinctive Mission Revival exterior, and an elaborate Louis XV interior. Return to home by early evening.
