Day 1 - September 22, 2024

Group has arranged for motor coach from your City.

8:00 a.m. Leave your city and make necessary rest stops. In Green Bay, have a noon lunch (included) at the Packer Hall of Fame. After lunch, tour Lambeau Field & Packer Hall of Fame. Experience the Packers' history-rich facility first-hand and see several behind-the-scenes areas. (Tours are secondary and subject to change if a building event is booked.) On the standard tour a guide will lead you through the Atrium, up to the exclusive Club Level for a look at the Legends Club. Go through the player's tunnel, learn and feel the indomitable spirit and impassioned energy that makes the Packers and Lambeau Field so endearing. Leave Green Bay and enter Door County. Sense the transformation to a different lifestyle in "The Door." Check into Rowley's Bay Resort in Ellison Bay for three nights lodging. The resort has an elevator. There is a restaurant, indoor pool, sauna, whirlpool, fitness room, tennis court, boats for hire and bicycles to rent. Have dinner (included) in the resort dining room. [L,D]



Day 2 - September 23, 2024

Have breakfast (included) at the Resort and meet your Door County tour guide. In Northport, WI board the Washington Island Ferry. Take the five-mile ride across the once-treacherous waters of Death's Door, where Green Bay and Lake Michigan meet. Once ashore on Washington Island, embark on a tour with sightseeing, shopping and eating hosted by the 600 residents who call the island home. Visit some attractions such as the School House Beach and a Lavender Farm. Have lunch (included) and ferry back to Northport. Shop at Seaquist Orchards. Tonight, is the Fish Boil Storyteller reenactment with Peter Rowley. He provides an entertaining look at the folklore of this Door County tradition. Boil-over and dinner buffet (included). [B,L,D]



Day 3 - September 24, 2024

After breakfast (included), your Door County tour guide will take you to the hand-carved **Norwegian Bjorklund Chapel**. Drive by Baileys Harbor and have lunch (included) at **Al Johnson's Restaurant**. This unique complex of buildings from Sweden invites exploration. The sod roof is kept well-trimmed by goats. This afternoon tour **Eagle Bluff Lighthouse**. It is perched on a bluff 76 feet above Green Bay's glistening waters. Hear stories of the keepers who manned the light from 1868 to 1926. It is furnished with original and authentic period antiques. Return to Rowleys Bay Resort for dinner (Included). Spend the evening at **Peninsula Players Theatre**. It is America's oldest professional resident seasonal theater. The performance is "*George Washington's Teeth*" - A Midwest premiere by Mark St. Germain. False teeth, false history and genuine laughter. - This zany new comedy follows the exploits of the struggling New Union Historical Society as its members battle the city council to keep the doors open and prevent being banished to the basement of the town's senior center. With time running out to renew their lease, the Society's three female members must find creative ways to snare new associates and lure visitors to their sleepy New England town. When a set of George Washington's dentures turns up in the hands of an unexpected rival, the ladies brace themselves for all-out war. Heartfelt and some-what historic, this new madcap comedy proves that our differences don't divide us, they make us strong. [B,L,D]



Day 4 - September 25, 2024

After breakfast (included) travel to Sturgeon Bay to tour the **Door County Maritime Museum**. It covers the history of boat and shipbuilding for over 150 years, and contains antique ship equipment, recovered sunken artifacts and other sailing items, logs and charts. Explore the rich maritime history. Four beautiful galleries: Baumgartner Gallery - scale models, shipbuilding in Sturgeon Bay, "Sentinels of the Shore" lighthouse exhibit, The Peterson Gallery - a chronological history of shipbuilding going back to the 1800s, The Horton Gallery - new exhibits come every couple years (Sea Dogs, Pirates -- Ship to Shore, Ghosts, Freshwater Fury), John Asher Gallery - antique outboard motors, exhibit on the raising of the George M. Humphrey. Have an early lunch (on own) in downtown Sturgeon Bay or travel to Wausau for a late lunch (on own) at the 2510 Restaurant. Return to your city by late afternoon. [B]
